Mt. 7:24 Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock: 25 And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell not: for it was founded upon a rock. 26 And every one that heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them not, shall be likened unto a foolish man, which built his house upon the sand: 27 And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell: and great was the fall of it.

The two paths, 7:13-14 The two trees, 7:15-20 (cf. Luke 6:43-44) The two claims, 7:21-23 (cf. Luke 6:46) The two builders, 7:24 & 26 (cf. Luke 6:47-49) The two destinies, 7:25 & 27 (cf. Luke 6:47-49)

Let's observe what Jesus taught about two foundations and two destinies.

E. The Foundations Examined, 7:24-29

1. The Application of the Message, 7:24-27

a. The Sure Foundation – The Nature of the Lord's Words are the Basis for Having Everything, 7:24-25

(1) The Completion of the Structure, 7:24

<u>Mt. 7:24</u> Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock:

## Verses 21-23 contrast those who say one thing but do another.

Verses 24-27 contrast hearing and doing.

Jas 1:22 But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves.

23 For if any be a hearer of the word, and not a doer, he is like unto a man beholding his natural face in a glass: 24 For he beholdeth himself, and goeth his way, and straightway forgetteth what manner of man he was. 25 But whoso looketh into the perfect law of liberty, and continueth *therein*, he being not a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed.

# "Doers of the word" express a sense of joy via obedience in love to Christ.

Jn. 13:17 If ye know these things, happy are ye if ye

Real Christianity exhibits faith by obedience, or "works."

Jas. 2:14 What *doth it* profit, my brethren, though a man say he hath faith, and have not works? can faith save him? 15 If a brother or sister be naked, and destitute of daily food,

16 And one of you say unto them, Depart in peace, be ye warmed and filled; notwithstanding ye give them not those things which are needful to the body; what *doth it* profit? 17 Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone. 18 Yea, a man may say, Thou hast faith, and I have works: shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will

shew thee my faith by my works.

<u>19</u> Thou believest that there is one God; thou doest well: the devils also believe, and tremble. <u>20</u> But wilt thou know, O vain man, that faith without works is dead? The will of Jesus' Father (v. 21) now becomes "these sayings of mine" (v. 24). As throughout this section, Jesus was looking at a life in its entirety.

The two ways illustrate the start of the life of faith; the two trees illustrate the growth and results of the life of faith here and now;

The two houses illustrate the end of this life of faith, when God shall call everything to judgment.

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#### (2) The Coming of the Storm, 7:25

Mt. 7:25 And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell not: for it was founded upon a rock.

Each house in Jesus' illustration looks secure. However, severe testing reveals the true quality of the builders' work.

<u>Mt. 13:21</u> Yet hath he not root in himself, but dureth for a while: for when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is offended. <u>Prov. 10:25</u> As the whirlwind passeth, so *is* the wicked no *more*: but the righteous *is* an everlasting foundation.

<u>Prov. 12:7</u> The wicked are overthrown, and *are* not: but the house of the righteous shall stand.

<u>Prov. 14:11</u> The house of the wicked shall be overthrown: but the tabernacle of the upright shall flourish.

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Isa. 28:16 Therefore thus saith the Lord GOD, Behold, I lay in Zion for a foundation a stone, a tried stone, a precious corner stone, a sure foundation: he that believeth shall not make haste. <u>17</u> Judgment also will I lay to the line, and righteousness to the plummet: and the hail shall sweep away the refuge of lies, and the waters shall overflow the hiding place.

<u>2 Tim. 2:19</u> Nevertheless the foundation of God standeth sure, having this seal, The Lord knoweth them that are his. And, Let every one that nameth the name of Christ depart from iniquity. Torrential downpours were and are common in Israel. Wise men build to withstand anything. The wise person is a theme in Matthew.

The "wise" person is one who puts Jesus' "words" into practice. Thus the final reckoning will expose the true convictions of the pseudo-disciple.

Jesus compared Himself to foundation rock.

Mt. 16:18 And I say also unto thee, That thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. Isa. 28:16 Therefore thus saith the Lord GOD, Behold, I lay in Zion for a foundation a stone, a tried stone, a precious corner *stone*, a sure foundation: he that believeth shall not make haste.

**<u>1 Cor. 3:11</u>** For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ.

 b. The Sandy Foundation – The Neglect of the Lord's Words are the Basis for Having Nothing, 7:26-27

#### (1) The Completion of the Structure, 7:26

<u>Mt. 7:26</u> And every one that heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them not, shall be likened unto a foolish man, which built his house upon the sand:

Both structures had progress, and problems. The difference in results was due to the foundations.

<u>Psa. 11:3</u> If the foundations be destroyed, what can the righteous do?

#### (2) The Coming of the Storm, 7:27

<u>Mt. 7:27</u> And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell: and great was the fall of it.

Destiny may be delightfully delayed, but ultimately defined by the foundational decisions along the way.

<u>Prov. 16:25</u> There is a way that seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof *are* the ways of death. (14:12)

<u>Jn. 13:17</u> If ye know these things, happy are ye if ye do them.

So the sermon is ending with a challenge not to ignore responding to Jesus and his teaching.

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#### <u>Summary</u> To summarize this sermon:

Jesus' point in this section (vv. 13-27) was that entrance into the kingdom and discipleship as a follower of the King are unpopular, and they involve persecution. Many more people will profess to be disciples than really are. The acid test is obedience to the revealed will of God. Jesus began by describing the character of the kingdom's subjects (5:1-10). ✤He then explained their calling (5:11-16). ✤Next, He specified their conduct (5:17-7:12). Finally, He clarified their choices and commitments (7:13-27).

#### **Conclusion**

<u>Deut. 32:4</u> He is the Rock, his work is perfect: for all his ways are judgment: a God of truth and without iniquity, just and right is he.... 15 But Jeshurun waxed fat, and kicked: thou art waxen fat, thou art grown thick, thou art covered with fatness; then he forsook God which made him, and lightly esteemed the Rock of his salvation. ... **<u>18</u>** Of the Rock that begat thee thou art unmindful, and hast forgotten God that formed thee. <u>31</u> For their rock is not as our Rock, even our enemies themselves being judges.

An honest person must confront the reality of a personal foundation.

2 Sam. 22:32 For who is God, save the LORD? and who is a rock, save our God?

<u>Psa. 18:2</u> The LORD *is* my rock, and my fortress, and my deliverer; my God, my strength, in whom I will trust; my buckler, and the horn of my salvation, *and* my high tower.

<u>1 Cor. 10:4</u> And did all drink the same spiritual drink: for they drank of that spiritual Rock that followed them: and that Rock was Christ.

<u>1 Cor. 3:11</u> For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ.
