# SEARCHING THE SCRIPTURES AN OVERVIEW OF THE OLD TESTAMENT

#### JN. 5:39-40, 2 TIM. 2:15, MT. 11:28-30, LUKE 24:27, 32



<u>Jn. 5:39</u> Search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and they are they which testify of me.

<u>Jn. 5:46</u> For had ye believed Moses, ye would have believed me: for he wrote of me.

Luke 24:27 And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself. ... 32 And they said one to another, Did not our heart burn within us, while he talked with us by the way, and while he opened to us the scriptures? When these verses mentions the word *Scriptures,* they are referencing the Old Testament. The New Testament had not yet been given.

<u>Jn. 5:39</u> Search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and they are they which testify of me.

**Original Word:** ἐρευνάω **Transliteration:** ereunaó **Definition:** search; **Usage:** I search diligently, examine. <u>https://biblehub.com/greek/2045.htm</u> <u>2 Tim. 2:15</u> Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.

**Original Word:** σπουδάζω **Part of Speech:** Verb (<mark>Aorist Imperative Act</mark>.) **Transliteration:** spoudazó **Definition:** to make haste, to give diligence; **Usage:** I hasten, am eager, am zealous.

spoudázō – (figuratively) to move speedily by showing full diligence (fully applying oneself); acting fervently (speedy commitment) to accomplish all that God assigns through faith.<u>https://biblehub.com/greek/4704.htm</u> Mt. 11:28 Come unto me, all *ye* that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.

<u>29</u> Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. <u>30</u> For my yoke *is* easy, and my burden is light.

**Original Word:** μανθάνω **Part of Speech:** Verb (Aorist Imperative Act.) **Transliteration:** manthanó **Definition:** to learn; **Usage:** I learn; with adj. or nouns: I learn to be so and so; with acc. of person who is the object of knowledge; aor. sometimes: to ascertain.

*manthánō* – properly, *learning* key facts; gaining "*fact-knowledge* as someone learns from experience, often with the implication of *reflection* – 'come to realize' " (becoming a disciple) <u>https://biblehub.com/greek/3129.htm</u>

<u>Mt. 28:19</u> Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:

**Original Word:** μαθητεύω **Part of Speech:** Verb (<mark>Aorist Imperative Act</mark>.) **Transliteration:** mathéteuó **Definition:** to be a disciple, to make a disciple **Usage:** I make a disciple of, train in discipleship; pass: I am trained, discipled, instructed.

*mathēteúō* (from *mathētḗs*, "disciple") – to disciple, i.e. helping someone to *progressively learn* the Word of God to become a matured, growing *disciple*(literally, "a learner," a true Christ-follower); to train (develop) in the truths of Scripture *and* the *lifestyle* required, i.e. helping a believer *learn* to be a disciple of Christ *in belief and practice*. <u>https://biblehub.com/greek/3100.htm</u>

# Jesus taught that to "learn" of Him is to be "discipled."

A "disciple" is a "disciplined one."

Believers today need to be disciplined to learn the Old Testament as faithful disciples.
