The History of Father's Day in the United States

There are two stories of when the first Father's Day was celebrated. According to some accounts, the first Father's Day was celebrated in Washington state on June 19, 1910. A woman by the name of Sonora Smart Dodd came up with the idea of honoring and celebrating her father while listening to a Mother's Day sermon at church in 1909. She felt as though mothers were getting all the acclaim while fathers were equally deserving of a day of praise.

The other story of the first Father's Day in America happened all the way on the other side of the country in Fairmont, West Virginia on July 5, 1908. Grace Golden Clayton suggested to the minister of the local Methodist church that they hold services to celebrate fathers after a deadly mine explosion killed 361 men.

While Father's Day was celebrated locally in several communities across the country, unofficial support to make the celebration a national holiday began almost immediately. William Jennings Bryant was one of its staunchest proponents. In 1924, President Calvin "Silent Cal" Coolidge recommended that Father's Day become a national holiday. But no official action was taken.

In 1966, Lyndon B. Johnson, through an executive order, designated the third Sunday in June as the official day to celebrate Father's Day. However, it wasn't until 1972, during the Nixon administration, that Father's Day was officially recognized as a national holiday.

- This morning, our emphasis is upon "Being a Dad" (but is not for fathers only.)

I. THE ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF FATHERHOOD

A. The Reality of the Role

"Being a father means that you simply caused a woman to become pregnant. A dad, on the other hand, steps up and takes full responsibility for his role." 1 Tim. 5:8 But if any provide not for his own, and specially for those of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel.

- Men have too often been ignorant of the role of a dad.
- How does a man learn to be a dad?
- Children learn about fatherhood and being a dad within God's institution a home.

Deut. 6:1 Now these are the commandments, the statutes, and the judgments, which the LORD your God commanded to teach you, that ye might do them in the land whither ye go to possess it: 2 That thou mightest fear the LORD thy God, to keep all his statutes and his commandments, which I command thee, thou, and thy son, and thy son's son, all the days of thy life; and that thy days may be prolonged.

3 Hear therefore, O Israel, and observe to do it; that it may be well with thee, and that ye may increase mightily, as the LORD God of thy fathers hath promised thee, in the land that floweth with milk and honey.

- 4 Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God is one LORD:
- 5 And thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might.
- 6 And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart:
- 7 And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up.
- 8 And thou shalt bind them for a sign upon thine hand, and they shall be as frontlets between thine eyes.
- 9 And thou shalt write them upon the posts of thy house, and on thy gates.

B. The Relationship Reinforced

A father is to be continually teaching his children.

A. The Training

Prov. 22:6 Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.

B. The Textbook

7 And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up.

8 And thou shalt bind them for a sign upon thine hand, and they shall be as frontlets between thine eyes.

- 9 And thou shalt write them upon the posts of thy house, and on thy gates.
- Dads do not know all the answers to life's challenges and must be yielded to God, seeking His guidance in the present, realizing the ramifications for the future.

A. The Confronting Occasion – Judgment Seat

Rom. 14:12 So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God.

- B. The Crowning Opportunity Being a Dad
- ❖ To be a father is an opportunity to affect the future for good or for bad.

Psa. 127:3 Lo, children are an heritage of the LORD: and the fruit of the womb is his reward.
