
Genesis 18:1-33

7. The Perplexing of Faith, 18:1-33

a. The Encounter With The Lord, 18:1-6

- Gen. 18:1 And the LORD appeared unto him in the plains of Mamre: and he sat in the tent door in the heat of the day;
- <u>2</u> And he lift up his eyes and looked, and, lo, three men stood by him: and when he saw *them*, he ran to meet them from the tent door, and bowed himself toward the ground,
- <u>3</u> And said, My Lord, if now I have found favour in thy sight, pass not away, I pray thee, from thy servant:

- 4 Let a little water, I pray you, be fetched, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree:

 5 And I will fetch a morsel of bread, and comfort ye your hearts; after that ye shall pass on: for therefore are ye come to your servant. And they said, So do, as thou hast said.
- 6 And Abraham hastened into the tent unto Sarah, and said, Make ready quickly three measures of fine meal, knead *it*, and make cakes upon the hearth.
- The Lord interrupted Abraham's and Sarah's daily life with a perplexing visit.

The appearance of the "three men" was actually a theophany and two angels.

Gen. 19:1 And there came two angels to Sodom at even; and Lot sat in the gate of Sodom: and Lot seeing them rose up to meet them; and he bowed himself with his face toward the ground;

Heb. 13:2 Be not forgetful to entertain strangers: for thereby some have entertained angels unawares.

- Abraham was very hospitable, and he and Sarah prepared them a meal.
 - b. The Enlightenment From The Lord, 18:7-15
- 18:7 And Abraham ran unto the herd, and fetcht a calf tender and good, and gave it unto a young man; and he hasted to dress it.
- 8 And he took butter, and milk, and the calf which he had dressed, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree, and they did eat.
- 9 And they said unto him, Where is Sarah thy wife? And he said, Behold, in the tent.

- 10 And he said, I will certainly return unto thee according to the time of life; and, lo, Sarah thy wife shall have a son. And Sarah heard it in the tent door, which was behind him.
- 11 Now Abraham and Sarah were old and well stricken in age; and it ceased to be with Sarah after the manner of women.
- 12 Therefore Sarah laughed within herself, saying, After I am waxed old shall I have pleasure, my lord being old also?
- 13 And the LORD said unto Abraham, Wherefore did Sarah laugh, saying, Shall I of a surety bear a child, which am old?
- 14 Is any thing too hard for the LORD? At the time appointed I will return unto thee, according to the time of life, and Sarah shall have a son.
- 15 Then Sarah denied, saying, I laughed not; for she was afraid. And he said, Nay; but thou didst laugh.



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- During the meal, the Lord asked for Sarah's whereabouts and then announced that she would be having a son.
- Sarah revealed a perplexing response unbelieving the announcement, she "laughed within herself," because of practical circumstances.

18:12 Therefore Sarah laughed within herself, saying, After I am waxed old shall I have pleasure, my lord being old also? → 1 Pet. 3:3-6

- 1 Pet. 3:3 Whose adorning let it not be that outward adorning of plaiting the hair, and of wearing of gold, or of putting on of apparel;
- <u>4</u> But *let it be* the hidden man of the heart, in that which is not corruptible, *even the ornament* of a meek and quiet spirit, which is in the sight of God of great price.
- <u>5</u> For after this manner in the old time the holy women also, who trusted in God, adorned themselves, being in subjection unto their own husbands:
- 6 Even as Sara obeyed Abraham, calling him lord: whose daughters ye are, as long as ye do well, and are not afraid with any amazement.

- ❖ The Lord asked, "Is there any thing too hard for the LORD?" Such a question was a precursor to His direct verification of His promise – "...At the time appointed I will return unto thee, according to the time of life, and Sarah shall have a son."
- Luke 1:37 For with God nothing shall be impossible. (Zacharias and Elisabeth)
- ❖ Sarah's fear led to her denying truth and was then rebuked by the Lord − v. 15.
- Between this incident and the birth of Isaac was a perplexing challenge to Sarah's faith.

Was Sarah to trust the Lord and His promise, or lean unto her own understanding?

Prov. 3:5 Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding.

6 In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths.

Eventually, Sarah's perplexed faith triumphed over circumstances!

Heb. 11:11 Through faith also Sara herself received strength to conceive seed, and was delivered of a child when she was past age, because she judged him faithful who had promised. 12 Therefore sprang there even of one, and him as good as dead, so many as the stars of the sky in multitude, and as the sand which is by the sea shore innumerable.

- The Lord was about to explain other perplexing enlightenment regarding Sodom.
 - c. The Explanation By The Lord, 18:16-21
- 18:16 And the men rose up from thence, and looked toward Sodom: and Abraham went with them to bring them on the way.
- 17 And the LORD said, Shall I hide from Abraham that thing which I do;
- 18 Seeing that Abraham shall surely become a great and mighty nation, and all the nations of the earth shall be blessed in him?


- 19 For I know him, that he will command his children and his household after him, and they shall keep the way of the LORD, to do justice and judgment; that the LORD may bring upon Abraham that which he hath spoken of him. 20 And the LORD said, Because the cry of Sodom and Gomorrah is great, and because their sin is very grievous; 21 I will go down now, and see whether they have done altogether according to the cry of it, which is come unto me; and if not, I will know.
- While walking with the Lord, Abraham was revealed God's plan for the future.
- The Lord revealed His knowledge of Abraham's future and character.

d. The Engaging With The Lord, 18:22-31

- 18:22 And the men turned their faces from thence, and went toward Sodom: but Abraham stood yet before the LORD.
- 23 And Abraham drew near, and said, Wilt thou also destroy the righteous with the wicked?
- <u>24</u> Peradventure there be fifty righteous within the city: wilt thou also destroy and not spare the place for the fifty righteous that *are* therein?
- 25 That be far from thee to do after this manner, to slay the righteous with the wicked: and that the righteous should be as the wicked, that be far from thee: Shall not the Judge of all the earth do right?

- <u>26</u> And the LORD said, If I find in Sodom fifty righteous within the city, then I will spare all the place for their sakes.
- 27 And Abraham answered and said, Behold now, I have taken upon me to speak unto the Lord, which *am but* dust and ashes:
- 28 Peradventure there shall lack five of the fifty righteous: wilt thou destroy all the city for *lack of* five? And he said, If I find there forty and five, I will not destroy *it*.
- 29 And he spake unto him yet again, and said, Peradventure there shall be forty found there. And he said, I will not do *it* for forty's sake.
- 30 And he said *unto him*, Oh let not the Lord be angry, and I will speak: Peradventure there shall thirty be found there. And he said, I will not do *it*, if I find thirty there.

- 31 And he said, Behold now, I have taken upon me to speak unto the Lord: Peradventure there shall be twenty found there. And he said, I will not destroy it for twenty's sake.
- 32 And he said, Oh let not the Lord be angry, and I will speak yet but this once: Peradventure ten shall be found there. And he said, I will not destroy it for ten's sake.
- 33 And the LORD went his way, as soon as he had left communing with Abraham: and Abraham returned unto his place.



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- ❖ The angels went on to Sodom while Abraham fellowshipped with the Lord v. 22.
- Abraham was concerned about Lot and intervened for him with the Lord, going from a proposal of sparing Sodom for the sake of 50 down to 10 righteous people.
- Abraham knew that the Lord was just and evidently assumed Lot had influenced his family and a few others to be righteous.

- A most perplexing thing to consider is that Abraham's futile effort to spare Lot and Sodom squandered his opportunity of "communing" with the Lord about more important issues.
- A backslider's sins too often creates dilemmas for people in fellowship with the Lord.
- Hindrances to faithful fellowship will be a distraction if a believer does not stay alert.
- We need to be properly focused about important opportunities when communing with the Lord.
- Abraham stops asking before God stops giving:

Mat 6:8 Be not ye therefore like unto them: for your Father knoweth what things ye have need of, before ye ask him.

<u>Jas 4:2</u> Ye lust, and have not: ye kill, and desire to have, and cannot obtain: ye fight and war, yet ye have not, because ye ask not.

Summary

- The Lord will interrupt our daily routine with perplexing situations.
- The Lord's plans may involve perplexing mental/spiritual challenges.
- The Lord may reveal issues that require great wisdom regarding priorities.
- The Lord is always faithful, just, loving, and true.

Conclusion

<u>2 Pet. 2:7</u> And delivered just Lot, vexed with the filthy conversation of the wicked:

Jude 1:7 Even as Sodom and Gomorrha, and the cities about them in like manner, giving themselves over to fornication, and going after strange flesh, are set forth for an example, suffering the vengeance of eternal fire.

"33 And the LORD went his way, as soon as he had left communing with Abraham: and Abraham returned unto his place."

- Abraham went from the shade of his tent door, to fellowshipping with the Lord, back to the shade of his tent door.
- Distracted by Lot and Sodom, Abraham misused an awesome opportunity of fellowship!

1 Cor. 1:9 God *is* faithful, by whom ye were called unto the fellowship of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

1 Jn. 1:7 But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin.
