2022 THEME

<u>1 Cor. 12:31</u> But covet earnestly the best gifts: and yet shew I unto you a more excellent way.

<u>1 Cor. 13:4</u> Charity suffereth long, *and* is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up,

<u>5</u> Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil;
<u>6</u> Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth;
<u>7</u> Beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things.

This morning, we continue looking at *Love So Amazing* in what is commonly called the "Love Chapter," <u>I Cor. 13</u>. We began with examining the usage of "charity" instead of "love" as the translation of the Greek work *agape*.

The basic observation regarding the two words is that the translation of *agape* to *love* is focused upon the attribute of God while translating *agape* to *charity* focuses upon a believers interaction with others. <u>2 Thess. 1:3</u> We are bound to thank God always for you, brethren, as it is meet, because that your faith groweth exceedingly, and the charity of every one of you all toward each other aboundeth;

<u>1 Pet. 4:8</u> And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins.

As we continue the "Love So Amazing" chapter, remember that the focus of the word charity emphasizes God-like love of a believer toward others.

The chapter begins by expressing great things that are nullified without charity.

I. THE EXCLUSION OF CHARITY, 13:1-3

- A. Skill Without Charity Is Commotion, 13:1
- B. Spirituality Without Charity Is Conceitedness, 13:2
- C. Sacrifice Without Charity Is Contemptible, 13:3
- In essence, the first three verses are expressing THE VALUE OF LOVE.

II. THE EXPLANATION OF CHARITY, 13:4-8

- The next few verses are expressing THE VIRTUE OF LOVE. Last week we observed The Patience of Charity, expressing humility.
 - A. The Patience of Charity, 13:4

<u>1 Cor. 13:4</u> Charity suffereth long, *and* is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up,

<u>1 Cor. 13:4</u> "The Humble Perspective" \rightarrow Humility

B. The Peace of Charity, 13:5

<u>1 Cor. 13:5</u> Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil;

<u>1 Cor. 13:5</u> "The Unselfish Perspective" → Harmlessness This morning, we continue to observe the positive explanation of charity and how it is manifested toward others.

C. The Praise of Charity, 13:6

<u>1 Cor. 13:6</u> Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth;

<u>1 Cor. 13:6</u> "The Discerning Truth Perspective" → Honesty

Charity rejoiceth not in iniquity, but Charity rejoiceth in the truth; The love depicted as *charity* in <u>1 Cor. 13</u>, begins with God.

<u>1 Jn. 4:19</u> We love him, because he first loved us.

- A believer who is trusting only in God, by faith, is transformed by God's love, enabling that believer to love like God loves:
- <u>1 Jn. 4:7</u> Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God.
- <u>8</u> He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love. ... <u>16</u> And we have known and believed the love that God hath to us. God is love; and he that dwelleth in love dwelleth in God, and God in him.

The charity in <u>1 Cor. 13</u> is efficacious by the Holy Spirit, <u>Gal. 5:22</u>, as He works in and through the believer, <u>Phil. 1:6</u>, and <u>2:13</u>, not naturally by the will of the flesh.

<u>1 Cor. 2:14</u> But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know *them*, because they are spiritually discerned.

The natural man glories in the tragedy of the wicked, or an enemy.

Schadenfreude is a combination of the German nouns Schaden, meaning "damage" or "harm," and Freude, meaning "joy." So it makes sense that schadenfreude means joy over some harm or misfortune suffered by another. https://www.merriam-webster.com/dictionary/schadenfreude On the other hand, charity toward others includes a personal attitude of disappointment when learning of another person's spiritual decline, injustice, or fall.

<u>Prov. 24:17</u> Rejoice not when thine enemy falleth, and let not thine heart be glad when he stumbleth:

Original Word: χαίρω **Transliteration:** chairó **Definition: to rejoice**, be glad; **Usage:** I rejoice, am glad; also a salutation: Hail.

xaírō – properly, to delight in God's *grace* ("rejoice") – **literally, to experience God's grace (favor), be conscious** (glad) for His grace.

- Charity does not find anything to celebrate that originates from a source of iniquity, or a violation of God's standard of justice or righteousness.
- **Original Word:** ἀδικία **Transliteration:** adikia **Definition:** injustice, unrighteousness; **Usage:** injustice, unrighteousness, hurt.
- adikía properly, the opposite of justice; unrighteousness, as a violation of God's standards (justice) which brings divine disapproval; a count (violation) of God's justice, i.e. what is contrary to His righteous judgments (what He approves). https://biblehub.com/greek/93.htm

<u>iniquity (n.)</u>

INIQ'UITY, noun [Latin iniquitas; in and oequitas, equity.] **1.** Injustice; unrighteousness; a deviation from rectitude; as the *iniquity* of war; the *iniquity* of the slave trade.

3. A particular deviation from rectitude; a sin or crime; wickedness; any act of injustice.

Your iniquities have separated between you and your God. Isaiah 59:1-3.

4. Original want of holiness or depravity. https://webstersdictionary1828.com/Dictionary/iniquity

- Charity does not rejoice in something that is a disapproval to God and His character.
- Charity does not condone unholy behavior.
- When a person's disobedience to God has caused heartache for self and others, be slow to question why "God" would "allow" punishment to the offender.
- <u>Prov. 11:5</u> The righteousness of the perfect shall direct his way: but **the wicked shall fall by his own wickedness**.

Eccl. 8:11 Because sentence against an evil work is not executed speedily, therefore the heart of the sons of men is fully set in them to do evil.

<u>12</u> Though a sinner do evil an hundred times, and his *days* be prolonged, yet surely I know that it shall be well with them that fear God, which fear before him:

<u>13</u> But it shall not be well with the wicked, neither shall he prolong *his* days, *which are* as a shadow; because he feareth not before God.

Jer. 6:15 Were they ashamed when they had committed abomination? nay, they were not at all ashamed, neither could they blush: therefore they shall fall among them that fall: at the time *that* I visit them they shall be cast down, saith the LORD. Jer. 8:12 Were they ashamed when they had committed abomination? nay, they were not at all ashamed, neither could they blush: therefore shall they fall among them that fall: in the time of their visitation they shall be cast down, saith the LORD.

<u>Zeph. 3:5</u> The just LORD *is* in the midst thereof; **he will not do iniquity**: every morning doth he bring his judgment to light, he faileth not; but **the unjust knoweth no shame**.

<u>Prov. 14:14</u> The backslider in heart shall be filled with his own ways: and a good man *shall be satisfied* from himself.

Ezek. 36:31 Then shall ye remember your own evil ways, and your doings that *were* not good, and shall lothe yourselves in your own sight for your iniquities and for your abominations.

<u>32</u> Not for your sakes do I *this*, saith the Lord GOD, be it known unto you: **be ashamed and confounded for your own ways**, O house of Israel.

Charity does not condone sinful action, but encourages repentance:

<u>Deut. 4:29</u> But if from thence thou shalt seek the LORD thy God, thou shalt find *him*, **if thou seek him with all thy heart and with all thy soul**.

- Charity does "rejoiceth in the truth." Truth is charity's focus.
- This *rejoicing* implies a key ingredient for cultivating and maintaining fellowship among believers:
- **Original Word:** συγχαίρω **Transliteration:** sugchairó **Definition:** to rejoice with; **Usage:** I rejoice with, congratulate.

Properly, sharing God's grace with another person, so that both rejoice together (mutually participate in God's favor, grace). https://biblehub.com/greek/4796.htm The object of motivation for deeper relationship among believers is TRUTH!

- Original Word: ἀλήθεια
- Transliteration: alétheia
- **Definition:** truth; **Usage:** truth, but not merely truth as spoken; truth of idea, reality, sincerity, truth in the moral sphere, divine truth revealed to man, straightforwardness.

Truth is defined in three specific areas that promote fellowship: The Lord Jesus, the Holy Spirit, and the Word of God: <u>Jn. 14:6</u> Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.

<u>1 Jn. 5:6</u> This is he that came by water and blood, *even* Jesus Christ; not by water only, but by water and blood. And it is the Spirit that beareth witness, because **the Spirit is truth**.

<u>Jn. 17:17</u> Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth.

Truth is the impetus of assurance for the believer:

<u>Psa. 145:18</u> The LORD *is* nigh unto all them that call upon him, to all that call upon him in truth.

<u>Jn. 15:26</u> But when the Comforter is come, whom I will send unto you from the Father, *even* the Spirit of truth, which proceedeth from the Father, he shall testify of me: <u>Summary</u>

We began with THE VALUE OF LOVE and have continued observing verses regarding THE VIRTUE OF LOVE:

<u>1 Cor. 13:4</u> "The Humble Perspective" \rightarrow Humility

<u>1 Cor. 13:5</u> "The Unselfish Perspective" → Harmlessness

<u>1 Cor. 13:6</u> "The Discerning Truth Perspective" → Honesty

Charity rejoiceth not in iniquity, but Charity rejoiceth in the truth;

<u>Conclusion</u>

<u>Col. 3:12</u> Put on therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering; <u>13</u> Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: **even as Christ forgave you, so also** *do* **ye**.

<u>14</u> And above all these things *put on* charity, which is the bond of perfectness.

<u>15</u> And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to the which also ye are called in one body; and be ye thankful.

- <u>16</u> Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord.
- <u>17</u> And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in
- the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him.
