We began in Genesis with the beginnings of the human race.

Tonight, we will observe "the Patience of Faith." Abraham and Sarah, together, began a journey of faith 62 years earlier. Patiently walking by faith, Abraham received God's promise of a son via Sarah. Now, Sarah's journey of faith has come to a close.



Sarah's life, parallel with Abraham's, is a picture of "the patience of faith."

12. The Patience of Faith, 23:1-20

a.The Death of Sarah, 23:1-2

<u>Gen. 23:1</u> And Sarah was an hundred and seven and twenty years old: *these were* the years of the life of Sarah.

<u>2</u> And Sarah died in Kirjatharba; the same is Hebron in the land of Canaan: and Abraham came to mourn for Sarah, and to weep for her. Sarah was born 2018 years after creation; she lived 127 years and died 2145 A.C. (which would be about 1859 B.C.)

Sarah is the only woman whose age is given regarding her death.

More information is recorded about Sarah's death and burial than Abraham's.

Kirjatharba is identified as being "the same is Hebron in the land of Canaan."

Sarah patiently waited 25 years to experience the promise of a son from God.

<u>Heb. 11:11</u> Through faith also Sara herself received strength to conceive seed, and was delivered of a child when she was past age, **because she judged him faithful who had promised**.

<u>12</u> Therefore sprang there even of one, and him as good as dead, *so many* as the stars of the sky in multitude, and as the sand which is by the sea shore innumerable.

An indispensable part of faith is the discipline to wait upon the Lord.

<u>Psa. 27:14</u> Wait on the LORD: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the LORD.

<u>Psa. 37:7</u> Rest in the LORD, and wait patiently for him: fret not thyself because of him who prospereth in his way, because of the man who bringeth wicked devices to pass.

Psa. 130:5 I wait for the LORD, my soul doth wait, and in his word do I hope.

While waiting upon the Lord, life requires attention to various challenges, even burials.

b. The Debate over the Sepulchre, 23:3-18

The recording of this transaction details several principles of negotiation:

Locate the place desired.

<u>23:9</u> That he may give me the cave of Machpelah, which he hath, which *is* in the end of his field; for as much money as it is worth he shall give it me for a possession of a buryingplace amongst you.

\circ Determine the price of purchase.

<u>23:14</u> And Ephron answered Abraham, saying unto him, <u>15</u> My lord, hearken unto me: the land *is worth* four hundred shekels of silver; what *is* that betwixt me and thee? bury therefore thy dead.

 Pay a fair price and purchase the property with a witness to the transaction.

<u>16</u> And Abraham hearkened unto Ephron; and Abraham weighed to Ephron the silver, which he had named in the audience of the sons of Heth, four hundred shekels of silver, current *money* with the merchant.

• Consider a transaction with future ramifications.

For almost 700 years, the cave of Machpelah was the burial place of the Patriarchs.

<u>Gen. 25:9</u> And his sons Isaac and Ishmael buried him in the cave of Machpelah, in the field of Ephron the son of Zohar the Hittite, which *is* before Mamre;

<u>Gen. 49:30</u> In the cave that *is* in the field of Machpelah, which *is* before Mamre, in the land of Canaan, which Abraham bought with the field of Ephron the Hittite for a possession

of a buryingplace.

<u>31</u> There they buried Abraham and Sarah his wife; there they buried Isaac and Rebekah his wife; and there I buried Leah.

<u>Gen. 50:13</u> For his sons carried him into the land of Canaan, and buried him in the cave of the field of Machpelah, which Abraham bought with the field for a possession of a buryingplace of Ephron the Hittite, before Mamre.

Josh. 24:32 And the bones of Joseph, which the children of Israel brought up out of Egypt, **buried they in Shechem, in a parcel of ground which Jacob bought of the sons of Hamor the father of Shechem** for an hundred pieces of silver: and it became the inheritance of the children of Joseph. Ex. 12:41 And it came to pass at the end of the four hundred and thirty years, even the selfsame day it came to pass, that all the hosts of the LORD went out from the land of Egypt.

<u>Gal. 3:17</u> And this I say, *that* the covenant, that was confirmed before of God in Christ, the law, which was **four hundred and thirty years after**, cannot disannul, that it should make the promise of none effect.

c. The Development and Security, 23:19-20

23:19 And after this, Abraham buried Sarah his wife in the cave of the field of Machpelah before Mamre: the same *is* Hebron in the land of Canaan.
20 And the field, and the cave that *is* therein, were made sure unto Abraham for a possession of a buryingplace by the sons of Heth.

The love story of Abraham and Sarah ends as Isaac and Rebekah begin their marital relationship.

<u>Gen. 22:23</u> And Bethuel begat Rebekah: these eight Milcah did bear to Nahor, Abraham's brother.

<u>Gen. 24:67</u> And Isaac brought her into his mother Sarah's tent, and took Rebekah, and she became his wife; and he loved her: and Isaac was comforted after his mother's *death*.

<u>Summary</u>

Sarah (Israel) dies and is replaced by Rebekah (the bride – for the beloved son.)

The life of Sarah is a reminder of the inevitability of every person: make choices; live with them; live and die by God's grace; throughout a lifetime...walk patiently by faith.

<u>Heb. 9:27</u> And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment:

<u>Psa. 23:4</u> Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou *art* with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me.

<u>Rev. 2:10</u> Fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer: behold, the devil shall cast *some* of you into prison, that ye may be tried; and ye shall have tribulation ten days: **be thou faithful unto death, and** I will give thee a crown of life.
