

JESUS - NAME ABOVE ALL NAMES

JEHOVAH (I Am That I Am) Ex. 3:13 And Moses said unto God, Behold, when I come unto the children of Israel, and shall say unto them, The God of your fathers hath sent me unto you; and they shall say to me, What is his name? what shall I say unto them?

14 And God said unto Moses, I AM THAT I AM: and he said, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, I AM hath sent me unto you.

On Wednesday nights our series is "Searching the Scriptures," which is a study of the Old Testament, specifically looking for various testimonies and passages typifying the Lord Jesus Christ:

Jn. 5:39 "Search the scriptures...they are they which testify of me."

<u>Jn. 5:46</u> For had ye believed Moses, ye would have believed me: for **he wrote of me**.

As we consider "Jesus – Name Above All Names," we are observing different name and titles that give us illumination about the Lord, His titles and symbolical revelations that assist us in learning more about Him. Tonight, we begin a new series of an important name of the Lord Jesus Christ – Jehovah. We must begin by considering the background regarding the name "Jehovah."

Background

❖What is the origin of the name "Jehovah?" We begin with Moses' encounter with the "burning bush." As Moses approaches the burning bush, he is attracted to the phenomenon of it burning ye not consumed. As he approaches, God speaks to him:

Ex. 3:4 And when the LORD saw that he turned aside to see, God called unto him out of the midst of the bush, and said, Moses, Moses. And he said, Here am I.

While arguing with the Lord about going back to Egypt, Moses asked God for identification to relate to the Israelites:

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14 And God said unto Moses, I AM THAT I AM: and he said, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, I AM hath sent me unto you.

The Hebrew word that is the English transliteration of "I AM THAT I AM" is commonly called the Tetragrammaton:

Tetragrammaton

noun

the Hebrew word for God, consisting of the four letters *yod*, *he*, *vav*, and *he*, transliterated consonantally usually as *YHVH*, now pronounced as *Adonai* or *Elohim* in substitution for the original pronunciation forbidden since the 2nd or 3rd century b.c. https://www.dictionary.com/browse/tetragrammaton

This issue is compounded because of a Jewish taboo on speaking God's name. Instead, the name HaShem (literally, "the Name"), would be used, or names such as Adonai (Lord) or Elohim (supreme one). The origin of the taboo is uncertain, perhaps stemming from fear of taking His name in vain, but as a result, the pronunciation was lost, and neither Jewish nor Christian scholars are sure how it was pronounced, or even how many syllables it had.

In the 6th through 10th centuries, the Masoretes, who worked to reproduce the original Hebrew text of the Bible, inserted the vowels from Adonai or Elohim into YHWH to get <u>YeHoWeh</u> or <u>YeHoWaH</u>. However, "Y" doesn't exist in Latin, so Latin-speaking Christian scholars replaced the "Y" with "I" or "J" to get "<u>JeHoWaH</u>," which became "Jehovah" as it spread throughout medieval Europe.

Christian scholars continued to refer to the Tetragrammaton as Jehovah until 19th and 20th century scholars returned to "Yahweh," a form of which dated back to early Christian writers such as the 2nd century Clement of Alexandria.

YHWH can be interpreted in multiple ways, from "<u>He</u> who will be, is, and has been" to "<u>He Who Is</u>" to "<u>He</u> Brings into Existence Whatever Exists" to simply "<u>I Am</u>."

- ❖ The name "Jehovah" is the English transliteration that the Bishops Bible used and then the King James translators followed the Masoretic formula of translating "Jehovah" as LORD and "Adonai" as Lord.
- Basically, the name "Jehovah" means "the selfexistent one." The name itself is a revelation of God to mankind.

<u>Jehovah-El Elyon</u> = *The Lord Most High* – <u>Gen. 14:22;</u> <u>Psa. 7:17, 83:18, 92:1; Mt. 28:18; Eph. 1:22</u>

Gen. 14:22 And Abram said to the king of Sodom, I have lift up mine hand unto the LORD, the most high God, the possessor of heaven and earth,

Psa 7:17 I will praise the LORD according to his righteousness: and will sing praise to the name of the LORD most high.

Psa 83:18 That men may know that thou, whose name alone is JEHOVAH, art the most high over all the earth.

Psa 92:1 It is a good thing to give thanks unto the LORD, and to sing praises unto thy name, O most High:

Mt. 28:18 And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth.
