Genesis 37

We began in Genesis with the beginnings of the human race.



He is one of the most prolific "types of Christ" in all of the Old Testament. This evening, we continue observing Joseph's life and his brothers' betrayal of him.

c. How Joseph was Sold by His Brethren, 37:28-36

(1) Their Fine Bargain with Cash, 37:28

<u>Gen. 37:28</u> Then there passed by Midianites merchantmen; and they drew and lifted up Joseph out of the pit, and sold Joseph to the Ishmeelites for twenty *pieces* of silver: and they brought Joseph into Egypt.

Ex. 21:32 If the ox shall push a manservant or a maidservant; he shall give unto their master thirty shekels of silver, and the ox shall be stoned.

Lev. 27:5 And if *it be* from five years old even unto twenty years old, then thy estimation shall be of the male twenty shekels, and for the female ten shekels.

Each brother received 2 pieces of silver + a lifetime of guilt.

(2) Their First Bite of Conscience,37:29-36

- <u>Gen. 37:29</u> And Reuben returned unto the pit; and, behold, Joseph was not in the pit; and he rent his clothes.
- <u>30</u> And he returned unto his brethren, and said, The child *is* not; and I, whither shall I go?
- <u>31</u> And they took Joseph's coat, and killed a kid of the goats, and dipped the coat in the blood;
- <u>32</u> And they sent the coat of *many* colours, and they brought *it* to their father; and said, This have we found: know now whether it *be* thy son's coat or no.
- <u>33</u> And he knew it, and said, *It is* my son's coat; an evil beast hath devoured him; Joseph is without doubt rent in pieces.
- <u>34</u> And Jacob rent his clothes, and put sackcloth upon his loins, and mourned for his son many days.
- <u>35</u> And all his sons and all his daughters rose up to comfort him; but he refused to be comforted; and he said, For I will go down into the grave unto my son mourning. Thus his father wept for him.
- <u>36</u> And the Midianites sold him into Egypt unto Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh's, *and* captain of the guard.

He returned to the pit, and then returned to his brethren. He was shocked to find Joseph was gone.

When Reuben exhibited anguish by renting his clothes (v. 29), his reaction must have caused conviction on his guilty brothers.

Joseph's brothers lied to Jacob about their brother's death.

We have already covered many parallels between Joseph and Jesus, and now, a few more. Joseph's brothers did not believe him (Gen 37:8,10, 11); neither did Jesus' brothers believe Him (John 7:5)

Jn. 7:5 For neither did his brethren believe in him.

 Joseph's Father sent him to his brethren (<u>Gen 37:14</u>). Jesus was sent by God, His Father to the house of Israel (the 12 brethren/tribes— <u>Mat 15:24</u>)

Mt. 15:24 But he answered and said, I am not sent but unto the lost sheep of the house of Israel.

 Joseph's coat was stripped from him (<u>Gen 37:23</u>). Jesus' tunic was taken from Him (<u>Mat 27:35</u>; <u>Mar 15:24</u>; <u>Luk 23:34</u>).


<u>Mt. 27:35</u> And they crucified him, and **parted his garments**, casting lots: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, They parted my garments among them, and upon my vesture did they cast lots.

 Both Jesus's and Joseph's coats were dipped in blood (<u>Gen37:37</u>; <u>Rev 19:13</u>)

<u>Rev. 19:13</u> And he *was* clothed with a vesture dipped in blood: and his name is called The Word of God.

- <u>Isa. 63:1</u> Who *is* this that cometh from Edom, with dyed garments from Bozrah? this *that is* glorious in his apparel, travelling in the greatness of his strength? I that speak in righteousness, mighty to save.
- <u>2</u> Wherefore *art thou* red in thine apparel, and thy garments like him that treadeth in the winefat?
- <u>3</u> I have trodden the winepress alone; and of the people *there was* none with me: for I will tread them in mine anger, and trample them in my fury; and their blood shall be sprinkled upon my garments, and I will stain all my raiment.
- <u>4</u> For the day of vengeance *is* in mine heart, and the year of my redeemed is come.
- <u>5</u> And I looked, and *there was* none to help; and I wondered that *there was* none to uphold: therefore mine own arm brought salvation unto me; and my fury, it upheld me.
- <u>6</u> And I will tread down the people in mine anger, and make them drunk in my fury, and I will bring down their strength to the earth.

<u>Mt. 27:51</u> And, behold, the veil of the temple was rent in twain from the top to the bottom; and the earth did quake, and the rocks rent;

<u>Summary</u>

Consider the timing of ch. 37. Joseph reveals his dreams and upsets his brothers.

The brothers go to Shechem to feed the flock, and Jacob sends Joseph to check on them.

Joseph is "in the field" and "a certain man" directed him to Dothan.

The brothers see Joseph afar off and conspire against him and his dreams.

- After the brothers throw Joseph in a dry pit, Reuben plans to save him.
- While Reuben is away, a caravan of Midianites just happen to come across the brothers at the same time.
- Judah proposes a deal to sell Joseph into slavery, the Midianites take Joseph to Egypt.
- Reuben returns, finds Joseph gone, and rents his garments in anguish.
- Joseph's brother develop a plan to deceive the "deceiver" – Jacob.

Jacob is deceived into believing that Joseph has been killed by wild animals.

The brothers think that they have circumvented Joseph's dreams.

God has allowed them their folly because He has other plans for the future.

<u>Gen. 50:20</u> But as for you, ye thought evil against me; but God meant it unto good, to bring to pass, as it is this day, to save much people alive.
