JESUS - NAME ABOVE ALL NAMES

JEHOVAH (I Am That I Am) Ex. 3:13 And Moses said unto God, Behold, when I come unto the children of Israel, and shall say unto them, The God of your fathers hath sent me unto you; and they shall say to me, What is his name? what shall I say unto them?

14 And God said unto Moses, I AM THAT I AM: and he said, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, I AM hath sent me unto you.

Prov. 18:10 The name of the LORD is a strong tower: the righteous runneth into it, and is safe.

Psa. 34:3 O magnify the LORD with me, and let us exalt his name together.

The Hebrew word that is the English transliteration of "I AM THAT I AM" is commonly called the Tetragrammaton:

Tetragrammaton

Original Word: יהוָה Transliteration: Jhvh

Definition: the proper name of the God of Israel

Jehovah-El Elyon = The Lord Most High,
Jehovah-Jireh = The Lord Our Provider
Jehovah-Rapha = The Lord Our Healer (also, Jehovah-Rophi).
Jehovah-Shalom = The Lord of Our Peace
Jehovah-Nissi = The Lord Our Banner
Jehovah-MeKaddishkem = The Lord Who Sanctifies
Jehovah Sabaoth = The Lord of Hosts (also "Zebaoth.")
Jehovah-Zidkenu – The Lord Our Righteousness
Jehovah-Shammah = The Lord is There
Jehovah-Roi -The Lord is My Shepherd
Jehovah Ropheka – The Lord Who Heals
Jehovah-Ori – The Lord is My Light
Jehovah-Magen – The Lord is My Shield
Jehovah-Hoseenu = The Lord Our Maker
Jehovah-Eloheka = The Lord Thy God
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Tonight, as we continue our series "JESUS – NAME ABOVE ALL NAMES," we observe another "Jehovah Title" – <u>Jehovah-Eloheeu</u> = *The Lord Our God* – <u>Psa. 99:5; Acts 10:36</u>

Jehovah-Eloheeu is used 174 times in the Old

Testament.



- ❖ Jehovah-Eloheeu includes a pronoun, "our," and is possessive, used as an attributive adjective. An <u>attributive</u> adjective is an adjective that is directly adjacent to the noun or pronoun it modifies. An attributive adjective is not separated from a noun by a <u>linking verb</u>.
- Two weeks ago, we considered Jehovah-Eloheka = The Lord Thy God, the possessive case of thou, a personal possession belonging to someone else.
- Now we consider Jehovah-Eloheeu The Lord Our God, expressing a collective possession of more than one.

I. JEHOVAH-ELOHEEU REPRESENTS IDENTITY

Ex. 8:10 And he said, To morrow. And he said, Be it according to thy word: that thou mayest know that there is none like unto the LORD our God.

<u>Deut. 4:7</u> For what nation *is there so* great, who *hath* God *so* nigh unto them, as **the LORD our God** *is* in all *things that* we call upon him *for*?

Josh. 24:17 For **the LORD our God**, he *it is* that brought us up and our fathers out of the land of Egypt, from the house of bondage, and which did those great signs in our sight, and preserved us in all the way wherein we went, and among all the people through whom we passed: ... 24 And the people said unto Joshua, **The LORD our God** will we serve, and his voice will we obey.

- The nation of Israel identified with Jehovah-Eloheeu.
- The host of heaven will identify with Jehovah-Eloheeu.

Rev 19:1 And after these things I heard a great voice of much people in heaven, saying, Alleluia; Salvation, and glory, and honour, and power, unto the Lord our God:

II. JEHOVAH-ELOHEEU REPRESENTS UNITY

1 Kings 8:57 The LORD our God be with us, as he was with our fathers: let him not leave us, nor forsake us:

<u>Psa. 20:7</u> Some *trust* in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the name of **the LORD our God**.

Psa. 99:5 Exalt ye **the LORD our God**, and worship at his footstool; *for* he *is* holy.

9 Exalt the LORD our God, and worship at his holy hill; for the LORD our God is holy.

The title *Jehovah-Eloheeu* indicates an inclusive unity of all represented by the pronouns *us* and *we*.

III. JEHOVAH-ELOHEEU REPRESENTS COMMUNITY

Psa. 105:7 He is the LORD our God: his judgments are in all the earth.

Jer. 3:22 Return, ye backsliding children, and I will heal your backslidings. Behold, we come unto thee; for thou art the LORD our God.

Both the Israelites and the believers as communities possess Jehovah-Eloheeu. Acts 2:39 For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call.

Rev 19:1 And after these things I heard a great voice of much people in heaven, saying, Alleluia; Salvation, and glory, and honour, and power, unto the Lord our God:

<u>Summary</u>

- JEHOVAH-ELOHEEU represents identity, unity, and community.
- Application of <u>JEHOVAH-ELOHEEU</u> as "the Lord our God" is indicative of possessing a relationship with God that is personal, and yet collective, as by a testimony of a congregation of believers.

<u>27</u> Go thou near, and hear all that **the LORD our God** shall say: and speak thou unto us all that **the LORD our God** shall speak unto thee; and **we will hear** *it*, and do *it*.

Josh. 24:24 And the people said unto Joshua, **The LORD our God** will we serve, and his voice will we obey.

1 Kings 8:61 Let your heart therefore be perfect with the LORD our God, to walk in his statutes, and to keep his commandments, as at this day.

Psa. 90:17 And let the beauty of the LORD our God be upon us: and establish thou the work of our hands upon us; yea, the work of our hands establish thou it.

Psa. 99:9 Exalt the LORD our God, and worship at his holy hill; for the LORD our God is holy.

Mark 12:29 And Jesus answered him, The first of all the commandments is, Hear, O Israel; The Lord our God is one Lord:

30 And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this *is* the first commandment.

31 And the second *is* like, *namely* this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these.
