

## JESUS – NAME ABOVE ALL NAMES

<u>Phil. 2:9</u> Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him **a name which is above every name**:

<u>Acts 4:12</u> Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved.

<u>Prov. 18:10</u> The name of the LORD is a strong tower: the righteous runneth into it, and is safe.

<u>Psa. 34:3</u> O magnify the LORD with me, and **let us exalt his name together**. A few weeks ago, we considered <u>Isa. 9:6</u>, but only focusing upon one title of the many that was appropriate for the day, being Father's Day: THE EVERLASTING FATHER

We will now consider another title of Christ in the same passage...

#### THE PRINCE OF PEACE

<u>Isa. 9:6</u> For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and **his name shall be called** Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, **The Prince of Peace**.

#### I. <u>THE DOMINION OF THE PRINCE</u>

A. The Lord Jesus is Ruler Over All

The title "prince" is indicative of the Lord Jesus Christ being over everyone and everything.

**Original Word:** ἄρχων; **Transliteration:** archón; <mark>Phonetic</mark> <mark>Spelling: (ar'-khone)</mark>

**Definition:** ruler, chief; Usage: a ruler, governor, leader, leading man; with the Jews, an official member (a member of the executive) of the assembly of elders.

*árxōn* (from *árxō*, "rule, take precedence") – properly, a *preeminent* ruler (chief); a commander with authority (influence) over people in a particular jurisdiction.

- The word archon, is a Greek word that denotes one who holds the highest and most exalted position, that emphatically means Jesus is truly Lord over all.
- The Lord Jesus is "Lord of all," "the head over all things to the church," "in all *things* he might have the preeminence," "the head of all principality and power,"
- <u>Acts 10:36</u> The word which *God* sent unto the children of Israel, **preaching peace by Jesus Christ:** (he is Lord of all:)

<u>Eph. 1:22</u> And hath put all *things* under his feet, and gave him *to be* the head over all *things* to the church,

<u>Col. 1:18</u> And he is the head of the body, the church: who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that **in all** *things* **he might have the preeminence**.

<u>Col. 2:10</u> And ye are complete in him, which is **the head of all principality and power**:

<u>Acts 4:12</u> Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved. B. The Lord Jesus Reigns Over All

- Being a ruler, He has a title of respect by others.
- The Lord Jesus does not only have a title, He controls His kingdom.

<u>1 Tim. 6:15</u> Which in his times he shall shew, who is the blessed and only Potentate, the King of kings, and Lord of lords;

<u>Rev. 19:16</u> And he hath on *his* vesture and on his thigh **a name written**, **KING OF KINGS**, **AND LORD OF LORDS**. <u>Rev. 17:14</u> These shall make war with the Lamb, and the Lamb shall overcome them: for **he is Lord of lords, and King of kings**: and they that are with him *are* called, and chosen, and faithful.

The realm of His leadership in this title is called "peace."

## II. THE DOMAIN OF THE PRINCE

The Prince's area of domain is emphasized as "peace." **PEACE**, noun [Latin pax, paco, to appease.]

**1.** In a general sense, a state of quiet or tranquillity; freedom from disturbance or agitation; applicable to society, to individuals, or to the temper of the mind.

- **2.** Freedom from war with a foreign nation; public quiet.
- **3.** Freedom from internal commotion or civil war.
- **4.** Freedom from private quarrels, suits or disturbance.
- **5.** Freedom from agitation or disturbance by the passions, as from fear, terror, anger, anxiety or the like; quietness of mind; tranquillity; calmness; quiet of conscience.
- Great *peace* have they that love the law.
- 6. Heavenly rest; the happiness of heaven.

**7.** Harmony; concord; a state of reconciliation between parties at variance.

**8.** Public tranquillity; that quiet, order and security which is guaranteed by the laws; as, to keep the peace; to break the *peace*. This word is used in commanding silence or quiet; as, *peace* to this troubled soul. <u>https://webstersdictionary1828.com/Dictionary/peace</u>

## **Original Word:** εἰρήνη; **Transliteration:** eiréné **Phonetic Spelling:** (i-ray'-nay)

**Definition:** one, peace, quietness, rest **Usage:** peace, peace of mind; invocation of peace a common Jewish farewell, in the Hebraistic sense of the health (welfare) of an individual.

*eirḗnē* (from *eirō*, "to *join, tie together* into *a whole*") – properly, *wholeness*, i.e. when all essential parts are joined together; *peace* (God's gift of *wholeness*).

- The Bible describes peace in several perspectives that believers should know.
- Peace from the Lord is His peace, given without working for it.

<u>Jn. 14:27</u> Peace I leave with you, **my peace I give unto you**: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

<u>Jn. 16:33</u> These things I have spoken unto you, that **in me ye might have peace**. In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world. By faith, believers are just before God, receiving peace from His wrath.

<u>Jn. 3:36</u> He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and **he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him**.

<u>Rom. 5:1</u> Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:

Spiritual peace is to be pursued by believers.

<u>1 Pet. 3:11</u> Let him eschew evil, and do good; let him **seek peace, and ensue it**.

<u>Col. 3:15</u> And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to the which also ye are called in one body; and be ye thankful.

Jas. 3:18 And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace of them that make peace.

The peace of God is the normal consequent of being saved.

<u>Rom. 14:17</u> For the kingdom of God is not meat and drink; but righteousness, and peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost. ...

<u>19</u> Let us therefore **follow after the things which make for peace**, and things wherewith one may edify another. <u>Rom 15:13</u> Now **the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace** in believing, that ye may abound in hope, through the power of the Holy Ghost.

<u>Rom. 8:6</u> For to be carnally minded *is* death; but **to be spiritually minded** *is* **life and peace**.

<u>1 Cor. 7:15</u> But if the unbelieving depart, let him depart. A brother or a sister is not under bondage in such *cases:* but **God hath called us to peace**.

<u>1 Cor. 14:33</u> For God is not *the author* of confusion, but of **peace**, as in all churches of the saints.

<u>Gal 5:22</u> But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith,

<u>Eph. 2:14</u> For **he is our peace**, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition *between us*;

Eph. 4:3 Endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

<u>Phil. 4:7</u> And **the peace of God**, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

- <u>8</u> Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things *are* honest, whatsoever things *are* just, whatsoever things *are* pure, whatsoever things *are* lovely, whatsoever things *are* of good report; if *there be* any virtue, and if *there be* any praise, think on these things.
- <u>9</u> Those things, which ye have both learned, and received, and heard, and seen in me, do: and the God of peace shall be with you.

# Psa. 119:165 Great peace have they which love thy law: and nothing shall offend them.

- Peace is a wonderful characteristic that accompanies a believer, and is given by "the Prince of Peace."
- The Lord Jesus Christ can calm any and every storm of life, for "He is our peace." (<u>Eph. 2:14</u>)

#### <u>Conclusion</u>

<u>2 Thess. 3:16</u> Now the Lord of peace himself give you peace always by all means. The Lord *be* with you all.

<u>1 Pet. 3:8</u> Finally, *be ye* all of one mind, having compassion one of another, love as brethren, *be* pitiful, *be* courteous: <u>9</u> Not rendering evil for evil, or railing for railing: but contrariwise blessing; knowing that ye are thereunto called, that ye should inherit a blessing.

<u>10</u> For he that will love life, and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips that they speak no guile:

<u>11</u> Let him eschew evil, and do good; **let him seek peace, and ensue it**.

<u>12</u> For the eyes of the Lord *are* over the righteous, and his ears *are open* unto their prayers: but the face of the Lord *is* against them that do evil.
