## Walking By Laith—so amazing

2024 THEME

2 Cor. 5:7 (For we walk by faith, not by sight:)

Our theme for 2024 is *Faith So Amazing*. The definition of faith, according to the Bible, is found in <u>Heb. 11:1</u> "Now **faith is** the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen."

- The exercise of faith contains assurance in God's promises even if tangible evidence is lacking.
- The "things hoped for" rests in the expectation and waiting for fulfillment.

Original Word:  $\dot{\epsilon}\lambda\pi$  ( $\zeta\omega$  Transliteration: elpizó **Definition:** to expect, to hope (for) **Usage:** I hope, hope for, expect, trust.

elpízō (from elpís, "hope") – to hope, actively waiting for God's fulfillment about the faith He has inbirted through the power of *His love* (cf. Gal 5:6 with Heb 11:1).

**Original Word:**  $\upsilon\pi \acute{o}\sigma\tau \alpha\sigma \iota\varsigma$  **Transliteration:** hupostasis **Definition:** a support, substance, steadiness, assurance **Usage:** (lit: an underlying), (a) confidence, assurance, (b) a giving substance (or reality) to, or a guaranteeing, (c) substance, reality.

Hypostasis – properly, (to possess) standing under a guaranteed agreement ("title-deed"); (figuratively) "title" to a promise or property, i.e. a legitimate claim (because it literally is, "under a legal-standing") – entitling someone to what is guaranteed under the particular agreement. For the believer, hypóstasis ("title of possession") is the Lord's guarantee to fulfill the His promises (cf. Heb 11:1 with Heb 11:6).

From God's perspective, without the exercise of faith, it is IMPOSSIBLE to please Him:

Heb. 11:6 But without faith *it is* impossible to please *him*: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and *that* he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

A believer cannot separate the exercise of faith from pleasing God: Original Word: εὐαρεστέω

Transliteration: euaresteó

**Definition:** to be well-pleasing

**Usage:** I give pleasure to, please (perhaps with the added idea of: rendering good service to).

euarestéō – to please (gratify) by giving what is acceptable. We only please the Lord by living in faith ("His inworked persuasions/preferences"). Accordingly, (euarestéō) and faith (pístis) are directly connected in the NT. <a href="https://biblehub.com/greek/2100.htm">https://biblehub.com/greek/2100.htm</a>

A life of faith is one in fellowship with God, possessing both faith and well-pleasing service to God.

Rom. 12:1 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.

2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what *is* that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.

Consider the example of the Lord Jesus:

Jn. 8:29 And he that sent me is with me: the Father hath not left me alone; for I do always those things that please him.

Believers are saved by grace through faith, becoming His workmanship and ordained to walk in a manner of good works, for His glory. Eph. 2:8 For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: 9 Not of works, lest any man should boast. 10 For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.

## <u>Summary</u>

- Throughout 2024, believers should express gratitude for God's grace by being well-pleasing, and acceptable to Him, which is our reasonable service.
- A simple formula to follow that is pleasing to God...the manner of a submissive life:
  - **→** Study the Scriptures 2 Tim. 2:15, Jn. 5:39, 46
  - → Pray without ceasing 1 Thess. 5:18, Jer. 33:3,
    Mt. 7:7, Jas. 4:16b

- ★ Witness all the time, every where <u>Acts 1:8</u>, <u>Mark 16:20, Acts 8:4</u>
- **→** Faithfully attend church Heb. 10:25
- → Maintain the fruit of the spirit Gal. 5:22-23
- ★Support world evangelism (missions) Mt. 28:18-20, Mk. 16:15, Lu. 24:47, Jn. 20:21
- ★ Be faithful in giving Mal. 3:8-11, Lu. 6:38, 2
  Cor. 9:6-7
