

JESUS – NAME ABOVE EVERY NAME Phil. 2:9

Phil. 2:9 Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name:

Acts 4:12 Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved.

Prov. 18:10 The name of the LORD is a strong tower: the righteous runneth into it, and is safe.

As we continue considering the names and titles of the Lord Jesus Christ, which one means the most to you, personally? As I contemplated that question, I thought of the Lord's abiding presence at all times, and in all situations. In consideration of His abiding presence, I am mindful of the term "Comforter." Tonight, we will consider that title of the Lord Jesus –

The Comforter Jn. 14:16

Jn. 14:16 And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever;

As the Lord Jesus began to prepare His disciples for His return to heaven, He began and ended Jn. 14 by stating, "Let not your heart be troubled."

Jn. 14:1 Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me. ...

27 Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

In the middle of the chapter, Jesus said, <u>Jn. 14:16</u>
"And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter..."

- By using the term, "another Comforter," Jesus was promising the Holy Spirit's influence to aid the disciples in place of Him, indicating that He, Himself is the Comforter.
- The Lord Jesus used a synonymous title in 1 Jn. 2:1, being translated as Advocate:

1 Jn. 2:1 My little children, these things write I unto you, that ye sin not. And if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous:

The Greek word translated both Comforter and Advocate is "παράκλητος" – simply defined means "one called to your side."

Original Word: παράκλητος Transliteration: paraklétos

Definition: called to one's aid

Usage: (a) an advocate, intercessor, (b) a consoler,

comforter, helper, (c) Paraclete.

paráklētos (from pará, "from close-beside" and kaléō, "make a call") – properly, a legal advocate who makes the right judgment-call because close enough to the situation. paráklētos ("advocate, advisor-helper") is the regular term in NT times of an attorney (lawyer) – i.e. someone giving evidence that stands up in court.

A good verse that indicates the same principle is Prov. 18:24.

Prov. 18:24 A man that hath friends must shew himself friendly: and there is a friend that sticketh closer than a brother.

- The practicality of the Lord Jesus as our true Comforter is as follows:
 - ➤ A true Comforter is by your side when you need encouragement.
 - ➤ A true Comforter is by your side when you are all alone.

- ➤ A true Comforter is by your side when everything is calm with no problems.
- ➤ A true Comforter is by your side when you need someone just to listen.
- ➤ A true Comforter is by your side when tragedy overwhelms you.
- ➤ A true Comforter is by your side when you celebrate a victory.
- ➤ A true Comforter is by your side when you need correction.

Prov. 17:17 A friend loveth at all times, and a brother is born for adversity.

<u>Prov. 27:9</u> Ointment and perfume **rejoice the heart**: so *doth* the sweetness of **a man's friend by hearty counsel**.

Prov. 27:17 Iron sharpeneth iron; so a man sharpeneth the countenance of his friend.

- **A** true Comforter is a Protector.
 - Someone that has your back.

- A true Comforter is a Peacemaker.
 - Someone that calms the troubling times.
- A true Comforter is a Provider.
 - Someone that will provide all your needs.

Phil. 4:19 But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus.

A true Comforter is a Partner.

Heb. 13:5b "...for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee."

Josh. 1:9 Have not I commanded thee? Be strong and of a good courage; be not afraid, neither be thou dismayed: for the LORD thy God is with thee whithersoever thou goest.

Summary

- Mt. 11:28 Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.
- 29 Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls.
- 30 For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.
